Hockey AB Update

Semi Annual meeting planned for November



Provincial applications have been sent out and are due by **November 15**th. Please communicate with B. Long/K. Kobelka if you are interested so we don't end up with competing applications K. Kobelka has joined the Hockey Alberta AA review committee. The purpose is to review the structure of AA hockey across the province. The focus is still in development (not sure if Pee Wee will be included)

Question: What is the idea behind the change? Primarily a rural initiative; want to create draw zones to increase the competitiveness of AA teams from rural areas. Calgary's challenge at the Pee Wee level will be ice availability for 2-hour games. This review likely wouldn't affect much at the Bantam level.

Coaching qualifications

Same requirements as last year except that Checking skills are now required at the Atom level. Deadline is **November 15**.

Hockey Canada Update

Questions: Can you comment on the state of Winsport ice availability? Some ice was lost at Winsport and meetings ensued with Hockey Calgary. Winsport criteria is that 75% of prime time ice is to be dedicated to youth sport – not just Hockey Calgary. Balancing their revenue as a business with community needs. Conversations will continue.

Newly negotiated rates with Hockey Alberta/Hockey Calgary – please review and follow these rates. Outside of Calgary, the fees are different and may be higher than in Calgary.

Issues with hiring officials in Golden as they are very short on referees – better not to travel with officials from Calgary. Consider other locales.
