Expectations

- That scorekeepers understand how to write up a game sheet
- Game sheets are accurate records of what occurred during a game
- Scorekeepers are confident in how to write a Gamesheet & support on ice officials

What is recorded on the Gamesheet?

- Date
- Time
- Location
- Team Rosters (includes players, coaches, trainers)
 - Suspended player/coaches are not permitted on the bench
- Officials/Timekeepers (names to be printed legibly)
- Goals & Assists
- Penalties

Things to Remember

- If it wasn't recorded, it didn't happen.
- We need your help to make sure ALL the goals, assists and penalties are properly recorded
- If you need assistance or have questions during the game, ask the officials
- As an off-ice official, remain neutral and conduct themselves in a respectful manner

What Do I fill out?

Before the game?

- Date / Time
- Location
- Team Rosters - Filled out by teams (usually a sticker)
 - Check to see that "Assistants" and "Captains" are listed
 - Make sure roster is signed by head coach or assistant coach when HC is absent

During the game?

- Goals & Assists
 - Player Number
 - Time of Goal
- Penalties
 - Time of penalty, Type of penalty, and all other necessary fields
- # of Minutes of each

Referees Gamesheet Responsibilities (FYI)

- ➔ Sign the gamesheet
- ➔ Check to make sure all listed penalties are recorded and correct
- ➔ Write Game Reports
 - Team, player, infraction
 - Time of penalty
 - Add a description of the event
 - Hockey Canada Rule number

Penalties

Which Penalties do I Record?

Class of Penalty	Type of Penalty	Time	Who serves the penalty?
Minor	(ex, Tripping, Hooking, Head Contact, etc.)	2 min or 4 min Double Minor	Player who was assessed the penalty (OR if it's a CFB, player is ejected and player from the ice serves the penalty)
Bench Minor	ex. Too Many Players	2 min	Player from the ice at the time of the penalty
Major	ex. Cross Checking, Spearing, etc.	5 min	Player who was assessed the penalty is ejected from the game AND a player from the ice serves the penalty
Match	ex. Match for Cross Checking, Match for Spearing, etc.	5 min	Player who was assessed the penalty is ejected from the game AND a player from the ice serves the penalty
Misconduct	Misconduct	10 min	Player who was assessed the penalty. (IF the Misconduct results in an ejection, a player from the ice is NOT required)
Game Misconduct	Game Misconduct	10 min	Player is ejected from the game, a player from the ice is not required in the penalty box
Gross Misconduct	Gross Misconduct	10 min	Player is ejected from the game, a player from the ice is not required in the penalty box
Penalty Shot	Penalty Shot	No Time Recorded	No Player serves in the Penalty Box unless it is a double minor/major/match penalty
Game Ejection	Game Ejection	No Time Recorded	Player is ejected from the game. Player from the ice will serve the minor/major penalty

Why is it Important?

- League officials need to know what happened on the ice
- The information provided helps determine player stats, penalty minutes, suspensions served, etc.
- Ensures the correct players or team officials are identified for the above (including suspensions)

What do I Record?

- Time of the penalty in the offending team's section of the score sheet
- Player number
- Type of infraction
- Number of Minutes for the penalty
 - 2, 4, 5 or 10

Penalty Examples

Example 1 – Minor Penalty

2-minute Slashing Penalty in the 2nd Period at 12:23

Per	No	Served by	Offence	Min	Off	Start	On
2	84	84	Slashing	2	12:23	12:23	

The "ON" section record when the player returned to the ice. This would either be after 2 minutes (penalty expired) or if a goal is scored on the powerplay.

Example 2 – Double Minor Penalty

4-minute Head Contact Penalty in the 1st Period at 3:40

Per	No	Served by	Offence	Min	Off	Start	On
1	5	5	Head Contact	4	3:40	3:40	

The "ON" section record when the player returned to the ice. This would either be after 4 minutes (penalty expired) or if a goal is scored on the powerplay.

4 minutes is what is known as a “Double Minor” or two minor penalties stacked together. ***If a goal is scored before the 1:40 mark, then the second minor Penalty (2 min) would start.***

- EXAMPLE: Goal is scored at 2:34. Second Minor starts at 2:34. If no goal is scored during the second minor, the player would return to the ice at 0:34.

Per	No	Served by	Offence	Min	Off	Start	On
1	5	5	Head Contact	4	3:40	3:40	0:34

Example 3 – Checking from Behind Penalty

2-minute Checking from Behind Penalty in the 3rd Period at 5:45

Per	No	Served by	Offence	Min	Off	Start	On
3	71	3	Check from Behind	2	5:45	5:45	
2	71	71	Game Misconduct	10	5:45		

Checking from Behind can be called as a 2-minute minor penalty or a 5-minute major penalty at the referee’s discretion. ***However, every CFB penalty is ALWAYS accompanied with a Game Misconduct Penalty (10-minute).***

- **NOTE:** All Game Misconducts, Misconducts, and Gross Misconducts count for 10 minutes. However, these penalties are not served by a teammate of the infracting player.
- The time penalty associated with the CFB (2 or 5 min) must be served by a player who was on the ice at the time of the infraction.

Example 4 – 3 Stick Infractions or 3 Head Contact Penalties

3 Stick Infractions incurred by the same player. 3rd infraction incurred at 4:17 of the 2nd Period.

Per	No	Served by	Offence	Min	Off	Start	On
1	12	12	Slashing	2	12:20	12:20	10:20
1	12	12	Cross Check	2	3:42	3:42	2:00
2	12	17	Spear	4	4:17	4:17	
2	12	12	Game Ejection		4:17		

Incurring a 3rd Stick Infraction in the same game is accompanied with a Game Ejection. The Game Ejection must be recorded on a separate line and a different player from the ice will serve the 3rd stick infraction as the offending player has been ejected.

- **NOTE:** There is no time put in for Game Ejection or Penalty Shot

Example 5 – Major or Match Penalty

5-minute Major Penalty for Cross Checking in the 1st Period at 10:27

Per	No	Served by	Offence	Min	Off	Start	On
1	10	2	Cross Check	5	10:27	10:27	5:27
1	10	10	Game Misc	10	10:27		

All Major Penalties are accompanied by a Game Misconduct.

- **NOTE:** All Game Misconducts, Misconducts, and Gross Misconducts count for 10 minutes. However, these penalties are not served by a teammate of the infracting player.
- The 5-minute time penalty associated with a Major or Match penalty must be served by a player who was on the ice at the time of the infraction.

Example 6 – Bench Minor Penalty with Coach Game Misconduct

2-minute Bench Minor Penalty with Coach Game Misconduct in the 3rd Period at 1:47

Per	No	Served by	Offence	Min	Off	Start	On
3		2	Bench Minor	2	1:47	1:47	
3		Coach	Game Misc	10	1:47		

Coaches can receive penalties.

- **NOTE:** All Game Misconducts, Misconducts, and Gross Misconducts count for 10 minutes. However, these penalties are not served by a teammate of the infracting player.
- The 2-minute time penalty associated with a Bench Minor penalty must be served by a player who was on the ice at the time of the infraction.

Example 7 – Gross Misconduct

Gross Misconduct Penalty in the 3rd Period at 9:58

Per	No	Served by	Offence	Min	Off	Start	On
3	4	4	Gross Misc	10	9:58	9:58	

Any player receiving a Gross Misconduct is removed from the game.

- **NOTE:** All Game Misconducts, Misconducts, and Gross Misconducts count for 10 minutes. However, these penalties are not served by a teammate of the infracting player.

Example 8 – Penalty Shot

Penalty Shot Awarded in the 2nd Period at 7:30

Per	No	Served by	Offence	Min	Off	Start	On
2			Penalty Shot		7:30		

Penalty Shots are not incurred or served by any individual player. In addition, there is no time length recorded. However, the time of the infraction is still recorded in the “OFF” section.
