

Midget AA and Junior B Playoff Overtime Rules FAQ

28 Playoff Overtime Rules

- (a) In Midget AA and Junior B (CJHL) leagues, games tied at the end of regulation will continue with a "sudden death" overtime in the following manner:
 - 1. The Game Clock will be set to the remainder of the time permit. Clock will be set to the remaining permit time (as shown on the rink board or screen). Play will be run time for the remainder of the allocated permit time. For example, if regulation time ends at 8:30 and the permit goes to 8:45, the clock will be set at 15 minutes. If there is no permit time left at the end of regulation time, then proceed to a shootout as per (a) 4.
 - 2. The first 5 minutes will be played 4 on 4 (plus goalie).
 - 3. Following the first stoppage of play after the first 5 minutes, the overtime will be played 3 on 3 plus goalie).
 - 4. If the game remains tied after the overtime period, a "sudden death" shootout will commence to determine a winner. No player may shoot twice until everyone who is eligible has shot. Shootout will commence with 3 shooters per team. The team with the most goals after the first 3 players per team have gone will be the winner. If still tied the shootout will continue with 1 player per team shooting. If one team scores they are declared the winner. This format will continue till a winner is declared. Additional time for the shootout will have to be requested of the rink attendant. Whenever possible the league Coordinator will do so.
- (b) If a penalty occurs in the first 5 minutes, teams will play 5 on 4 (plus goalie). If a second penalty occurs against the shorthanded team prior to the expiration of the first penalty, teams will play 5 on 3 (plus goalie). If a penalty occurs or is being served following the first stoppage of play after the first 5 minutes, teams will play 4 on 3 (plus goalie). If a second penalty occurs against the shorthanded team prior to the expiration of the first penalty, teams will play 5 on 3 (plus goalie). At the first stoppage of play following the expiration of a penalty, teams will return to 4 on 4 (plus goalie) or 3 on 3 (plus goalie).
- (c) If the game remains tied and cannot be concluded due to unforeseen circumstances, and timing does not permit scheduling additional ice time to complete the overtime, the team that scored first in the game in question shall be declared the winner.
- (d) If the game ends 0-0 then the team with the fewest penalty minutes in regulation time will be declared the winner.
- (e) If the teams are tied in penalty minutes, then the teams with the most goals in the current playoff series will be declared the winner.
- (f) If the teams are tied as this is the first game of the series, then the team with the most goals in the regular season will be declared the winner.
- (g) If the teams are still tied, then the team with the fewest goals against in the regular season will be declared the winner.
- (h) If the teams are still tied, then the higher ranked team in the regular season standings will be declared the winner.
